Glendale Unwilling Host to American Nazi Party

GLENDALE, Calif. (AP) — A grim-looking, brown-shirted storm trooper guards the door, a portrait of Der Fuehrer adorns the mantel and, outside, the city of Glendale seethes.

City officials, clubs and churches have been fuming since Dec. 2, when George Lincoln Rockwell, commander of the American Nazi party, announced the opening of his party's Western headquarters — in Glendale.

Said Rockwell at a news conference: "After four years of effort, we have secured a headquarters — a center of resistance to communism, Zionism and race mixing."

Why did he pick Glendale?

Because, he said it's a nice American town and "it's a white man's town. It's the best town for us." He apparently referred to unsupported rumor that Negroes have not been allowed to settle in Glendale.

City Manager C.E. Perkins says of the Nazis: "We feel, and I'm sure everyone else in Glendale believes, they do not belong here. The resentment being expressed indicates a total anti-city feeling against them. We are hoping they don't make a serious effort to locate here."

The Nazis seem determined to stay.

Their self-styled Western division commander, Ralph Forbes, 24, vowed to fight efforts to evict him from the newly leased headquarters.

"I intend to use the house as a center of resistance for the white man to fight communism. I'll fight, an! we will survive."

We will not be driven out," he declared.

Forbes said his Glendale headquarters serves Nazi groups in "Redondo Beach, Long Beach, the San Fernando Valley and other areas." He did not estimate how many members the new office serves.

The drive to remove Forbes and his handful of followers has already begun, however.

First, the city refused to turn on electricity, saying Forbes would have to sign an affidavit that the house would be used only as a residence, not for Nazi party activities.

"I'll not sign any affidavits," Forbes retorted. "I think that's persecution."

Lacking electricity, the Nazis meet by candlelight.

Next, the landlord, Dom Razzano, said he'd file a 30-day notice of eviction on grounds his property near the house has been placed in jeopardy by the notoriety of the Nazis.

Razzano said Forbes didn't mention using the house as a headquarters when he took the lease. He said the lease forbids putting up signs or keeping armed guards on the property, but Forbes isn't restrained from holding meetings or distributing literature.

Forbes said the lease states the house may be used both as a dwelling and for political purposes. Razzano agreed but said he was unaware Forbes was a Nazi and believed him to be associated with either the Democratic or Republican parties.

In the latest move to dislodge the Nazis, the city of Glendale went to Municipal Court. The city charged that Forbes and his group violated four sections of the municipal building code by operating a meeting hall in a single-family dwelling without obtaining a city permit.

The violation carries upon conviction a maximum fine of \$500 for each defendant and up to six months in jail, or both.

Forbes, when notified to appear, said four others "will telephone Glendale police when

and ask to be served with their notices."

The others are Nazi Lt. Robert Giles, Ray Crawford, Robert Hemphill and Robert Martell, police said.

Los Angeles County also got into the act.

The Board of Supervisors decided amendments to state legislation covering activities of subversive organizations should be added to their 1965 legislative program.

The supervisors instructed County Counsel Harold W. Kennedy to draft an amendment to the subversive organization registration law to reinforce the law enacted in 1941 to control the German-American Bund and the Nazi party.
